
The tenets of our club and our parent organization are "Conserving, Restoring and Educating Thru Fly Fishing.

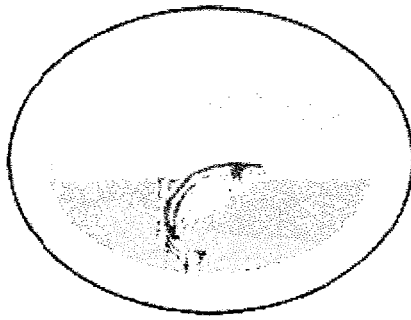

This letter is submitted in support of the Fishing is Fun grant application for the Soda Springs Park habitat restoration pilot, as part of the Fountain Creek Riparian Habitat Improvement Project.
